

## How to Display a Declared Kong in Wright-Patterson Mah Jongg (2020)


Any time a player exposes a kong, they get a supplemental/replacement tile from the Flower wall. Following are scenarios for how to arrange the exposure.


**Rule #19** The player's hand is Double Numbers (#50). They called a discard to expose their concealed pung as a kong. The called tile is right-side up and the concealed pung tiles are upside-down. The block would be scored as an exposed kong of Simples. If you had three concealed pungs you'd qualify for that double also.







Rule #20 The player's hand is Double Numbers (#50). They self-picked the fourth tile for a previously exposed pung then converted exposed pung to a kong. Since they have a suit exposed, the two tiles on the side of the exposed kong must be right-side up. The block would be scored as a concealed kong of Simples.






The player's hand is Heavenly Hash (#70). They first claimed a discard to complete pung of suited tiles, then later declared a concealed kong. The two tiles on the sides must be placed right side up. The kong would score as a concealed kong of Honors.







The player's hand is Eleanor (#44). They first claimed a discard to complete a pung of Honors. Later, they declared a concealed kong of a suited tile and placed all tiles upside down. Later, they claimed a discard to complete a pung of suited tiles. The two tiles on the sides must be placed right side up.. The kong would score as a concealed kong of Simples.







**Rule #21** The player's hand is Double Numbers (#50). They called a discard and exposed a pung then later self-picked the fourth tile. The tile must be placed on top in the middle of the three tiles (bold). The block would be scored as an exposed kong of Simples.





**Rule #22** The player's hand is Windy Gates (#42). They first declared a concealed kong with no suited tiles previously declared. All kong tiles are placed upside down. The kong would score as a concealed kong of Terminals.





Rule #23 The player's hand is Double Numbers (#50). They called a discard and exposed a pung. Later, self-picked the fourth tile and added it to their exposed pung so they now have a kong. If it is the winning tile for another player, they can declare mah jongg by "robbing a kong". The player who self-picked the tile can still get score for the gong and they need to take a supplemental/replacement tile from the wall then discard. No one can call that discard since someone else already declared mah jongg.
